**NO LIVE SHELLING** 

Enjoy our unique wildlife but please do not take them home. this includes: sand dollars



DO NOT LITTER: Plastic bags, styrofoam, and other non-Jegradable pollutants are deadly to turtles that mistake it for food

DO NOT HARASS TURTLES: Do not touch or move turtles. Stay out of the way as turtles crawl back into the water

DO NOT DISTURB nest sites or idenification markers

FILL IN LARGE HOLES on the beach that can trap hatchlings

NO FLASH PHOTOGRAPHY Quietly observe nesting turtles from a distance to avoid nest abandonment
